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What's New...

Welcome back to the new term, we hope you have all had a restful break and a Happy New Year! We have some new children joining this term and we welcome you too.

Staff News: As someone of you will know Naz left us last term to start a new job, she had a temporary position here and has been offered a permanent job where she used to work. You will still see Naz around as she is staying on as bank staff, she will be at preschool on a Thursday and Friday for the next few weeks.

Picking up at Home time: When picking up your child—if the children are outside, please wait at the gate for a member of staff to bring your child to you. If the children are all inside you are welcome to come and pick them up as normal. This is to stop the gate from opening during the session as we do not want children escaping.



Running out preschool clothes: Please can you return our spare clothes as we are running out of clothes. Can you also provide a spare change of clothes for your children at preschool. Thank you!

Winter is here: Please can you dress your child appropriately for Winter, even when its cold we go outside so children need a coat and suitable footwear. We also advice you to bring your children a hat and gloves as it is getting colder.

What are we learning about preschool:

The children have settled in really well, everyone is making friends and playing together. We are concentrating on speaking and literacy this term. We are doing lots of activities on fairy tales, fantasy stories and phonics. We will be reading lots of stories, making our own stories and carrying on with Jolly Phonics. The sounds we are focusing on this term are: s, a, t, p, i and n. We will be sending activities for you to do at home.

You can support your child at home by reading stories with them, singing lots of nursery rhymes and for the older children looking out for different letters and sounds in the environment. Don't forget to add what you have been doing on Tapestry.
